Ford's Heavy-Duty Truck

Ford announced its entry into the truck market on July 27, 1917, with the introduction of the Model TT one-ton, heavy-duty, worm-drive chassis. The truck utilized the same 20 horsepower engine as the car but featured lower gearing, resulting in a top speed of only 18 mph. The chassis could be equipped with a large selection of after-market bodies. In 1924, Ford offered its first complete, factory-built truck, but after-market suppliers continued to build cabs and bodies for the inexpensive Model TT chassis. The relatively sophisticated cab with hinged doors and glass windows on this truck was manufactured by the Field Body Company of Owosso, Michigan. The TT truck chassis continued with few changes to the end of Model T production in 1927.
