Customized Model T

To the unpracticed eye, all Model T touring cars from 1917 to 1925 look pretty much alike. These were the high-production years when 60% of the cars registered in the U.S. were Model T's. Peak production reached 2.1 million units in 1923. Prices dropped to an all-time low of \$260 in 1925 for the two-seat Runabout! The Touring body (seen here) dropped to a low of \$295. The body was slightly revised for 1921; a sloping windshield and a "one-man" top appeared in 1923. Most of the car, however, remained the same as 1909. It was a terribly obsolete car by this time... but who could resist the ever-decreasing price?
