Centerdoor now outfitted with a solid roof panel  
Latch-type window lifts  
Instrument panel supplied with all cars this year  
One valve cover plate instead of two

## Unique Body Style

This 1922 Ford Model T Sedan "Centerdoor" is similar to the one owned by the original owner of the attached trailer, as evidenced by many historic family photographs. In 1922, the much more costly "closed cars" (sedans and coupes) were beginning to gain in popularity due to their superior weather protection and dropping prices. The first Model T sedan debuted at \$975 in 1915, but this 1922 version retailed at only \$645. Production also leaped during this period from 989 units in 1915 to 146,000 units in 1922.
