The Last Year for Model T's

Model T sales began to decline in 1923 and by 1926/27, the Model T was hopelessly obsolete. Many makers had stylish colors, powerful 6-cylinder engines and hydraulic 4-wheel brakes. Marketed as the "Improved Car" with new colors, balloon tires and steel spoke wheels modernized the car somewhat, but the end was clearly in sight. Finally, a stubborn 63 year-old Henry Ford had to admit that the day of the Model T was over. Production ended at Highland Park on May 31, 1927, after 15,007,033 units had been assembled. Ford developed a very successful replacement car, in a short 6-month period, called the Model A.
