Four-Wheel Drive Model T!

Jesse F. Livingood (1894-1961) of New Virginia, Iowa, was a very creative inventor and innovator. He first converted a Model T to 4-wheel drive in 1914. He drove this car extensively until 1941, proving unquestionably its value in snow and mud. Mr. Livingood produced all of the specialized components needed for the assembly of this unusual vehicle. In more recent years, his son, Jesse R. Livingood, has recreated about (26) 4-wheel drive Model T's, using his father's original patterns and drawings. This amazing vehicle typifies the hundreds of innovative conversions that allowed the readily available and inexpensive Model T to perform tasks it's creators at the Piquette Plant never imagined!
