Fuel tank now oval (started late 1920)
Starter continued as an option for \$70
Stronger running board brackets

Production Now Strong

By 1921, the Ford Model T held 60% of the new car market! Six different body styles were available in 1921 on the Ford Model T chassis - a touring, runabout, coupe, sedan and a bare chassis. The 1921 Model T brought with it new construction techniques. The rear section of the car was constructed from three pieces of sheet metal instead of five. Seats were lowered and the top irons (that support the roof) for the Touring Car now extended through the quarter panel.

Ford produced nearly 3/4 million Touring cars in 1921 with overall production hitting almost 1.5 million vehicles! Daily production averaged about 4,000 cars per day.
